At Broad Chalke, keeping children safe is always a priority and our safeguarding duty. The purpose of these weekly updates is to raise awareness and support you as parents.

Children's development and mental health can be affected by their environment, relationships and experiences. Child development refers to the physical, cognitive, emotional and social growth that occurs throughout a child's life. Children's mental health, their cognitive, behavioural and social wellbeing, is affected by this development, as well as other factors like trauma and abuse.
