Year 6 Residential

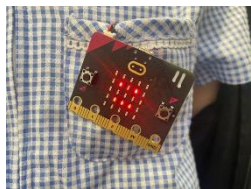

BE SMART ONLINE

- S SAFE** Keep your personal information safe. When chatting or posting online, don't share your name, address, phone number, school name, or any other personal information. Don't accept someone if you are unsure of who they are or what they've said to you.
- M MEET** Don't meet anyone you've met online unless you've been told it's safe to do so. If you do meet someone, tell a trusted adult. Don't go to a place you've never been to before.
- A ACCEPTING** Think carefully before you click on any links, download anything, or give out any information. Don't accept anything from someone you don't know.
- R RELIABLE** Be careful of what you see online. Not everything you see is true. Don't believe anything you see online unless you've checked it with a trusted adult.
- T TELL** Tell a trusted adult if something or someone online makes you feel uncomfortable, scared, or worried. Don't be afraid to tell them. You can always tell them if you're not sure.
- BE SMART WITH A HEART** Remember to think about how you're feeling and how you're feeling others. Be kind and respectful to others online. Don't be mean or bully. Think about how you're feeling and how you're feeling others.
