Update of summer works from DSAT

Over the Summer we will be commencing an upgrade to the fencing around the perimeter of the school. This has been discussed and agreed between the school, governors and the Trust who will be funding the work through their annual capital grant. The fencing will be higher than we are used to, in line with current guidelines, and will enhance our ability to keep children safe. It will include an access control system that will, again, further improve our security. The majority of the work will be completed during the holiday period, but it will likely run into the start of the new school year, so please be prepared for things to be a little different at the start of term.
