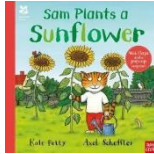

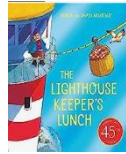

## FIRST AID

We wanted to clarify arrangements with our first aid provision and intervention.

- You will receive a **pink form** and phone call or face-to-face conversation if your child has had a bump to the head or face or if your child has a more serious injury e.g. bad sprain etc
- If your child has a minor injury in school (graze on the knee, bump on the arm etc), treatment will be given e.g. ice pack, plaster etc and your child will be given a sticker to indicate they have had a minor injury. No forms will be sent home but the incident will be recorded in school.
