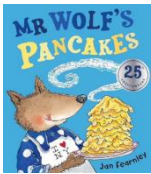

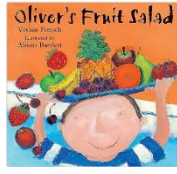
We hope you all had a lovely half term break 😊

SAFEGUARDING At Broad Chalke, keeping children safe is always a priority and our safeguarding duty. The purpose of these weekly updates is to raise awareness and support you as parents.

There have been a few safeguarding and behavioural incidents brought to my attention which have taken place outside of school at the local park. Please can I remind parents to be vigilant and ensure children are carefully supervised. Thank you.

We are currently exploring options to re-surface a section of the field which would increase the play surface area for Key Stage 2 children and allow them to engage in more physical activities. We have had a quote for £33,000 (ex VAT) to resurface the area and ensure it can be used all year round.
