Ready, Respectful and Safe

This week, we have been reminding the children about what it means to be **Ready, Respectful and Safe**, to support them with routines and expectations. Our focus, this week, has been on 'Ready' and our **SMART rules**. We have also discussed the importance of following rules, as well as the consequences of choosing not to, to help ensure that all children are able to learn and flourish at Broad Chalke.

Why not ask your child to show you some of the routines we have been practising, such as smart sitting or 'my turn, your turn'?

SMART WALKING

- 1 Walk on the left
- 2 Hands by your side
- 3 Voices off

SMART SITTING

- 1 Sit up straight
- 2 Voice off
- 3 Face the front

SMART LINING UP

- 1 Face the front
- 2 Hands by your side
- 3 Voices off

SMART LEARNING

- 1 Eyes on the teacher
- 2 Whole body listening
- 3 Focus- thinking hard

SAFEGUARDING *At Broad Chalke, keeping children safe is always a priority and our safeguarding duty. The purpose of these weekly updates is to raise awareness and support you as parents.*

We have recently received a number of parental concerns regarding pupil behaviour at the park. While children are outside of school hours and we are no longer acting *in loco parentis*, they are often still wearing their school uniform. For this reason, we continue to encourage the **Broad Chalke Way** of being **Ready, Respectful and Safe** beyond the school gates. Please remember that children must be supervised at the park at all times.

Today, during our Celebration Assembly, I spoke to all children about our expectations, with particular emphasis on being **Respectful**- showing kindness and living out our school values- and on staying **Safe**.

We kindly ask parents and carers to reinforce these expectations with their children, both through discussion and in practice. **Safeguarding is everyone's responsibility.**
