



Sport Premium Report

From September 2013, all schools have been provided with funding to support the Olympic legacy and to enable the delivery of effective sports provision. Within the Diocese of Salisbury Academy Trust we aim to provide high quality sport. At Broad Chalke Primary School, over a number of years we have provided the following:

- High quality sports coaching through partnership with specialist providers
- Adventurous residential and encounter experiences e.g. paddle boarding, gorge scrambling
- Opportunities to compete and participate in community sport tournaments e.g. high-five, tag rugby, quad kids, football
- Enrichment opportunities which encourage development of skills and knowledge e.g. football, wellbeing, cricket, high-five
- Continuing professional development for teachers and support staff
- Encouragement of outdoor learning, particularly in EYFS and Year 1
- Investment in new and appropriate sports equipment and the further development of our site to encourage sport, health, fitness and the engagement with the outdoors.





Impact Report for Last Year (2022-23)

Our Sport Premium Funding for the last academic year was: £17770. This money was used as follows and impacted as detailed below.
